According to Grosjean (2010), code switching is a distinctive way of speaking in which the speaker switches back and forth between L1 and L2. During the switch, usually the speaker moves to the other language completely in search of "a word, phrase or sentence" and then returns to the root language (Grosjean, 2010, p. 743).

One objection to this is that switching from one language to another takes time. In early research Kolars (1966) found that code-switching added about 0.3 to 0.5 seconds per switch to reading aloud, while Macnamara & Kushnir (1971) found 0.2 seconds per switch in silent reading.
