Parenthetical citation. An MLA parenthetical citation is created when the author's name is NOT in the sentence. Instead, the author's name is in parentheses after the sentence, along with the page number. Here is an MLA parenthetical citation example:

The MLA format is generally simpler than other referencing styles as it was developed to emphasize brevity and clarity. The style uses a straightforward two-part documentation system for citing sources: parenthetical citations in the author-page format that are keyed to an alphabetically ordered works cited page.

MLA style uses parentheses to cite sources. This is why it is called a parenthetical documentation system. To cite a source, the last name of the author (or the title of the article in quotation marks if no author is named) and the page number are used in sentences that contain a quote, paraphrasing, or a summary.

Punctuation marks such as periods, commas, and semicolons should appear after the parenthetical citation. Question marks and exclamation points should appear within the quotation marks if they are a part of the quoted passage, but after the parenthetical citation if they are a part of your text.

As detailed in the 2016 MLA Handbook, MLA uses a parenthetical documentation system, which means you will place citations in parentheses within your own sentences to indicate you have used ideas, information, and quotations from sources at that particular spot in your paper; the parenthetical information points to specific sources in an alphabetized list of works cited (it's not called a bibliography in MLA), which appears at the end of your paper.

An MLA 8 poetry citation must include the poet's last name, either in the main text or in a parenthetical citation. If line or page numbers are available, add these to the parenthetical citation directly after the quote. In the Works Cited entry, include the full publication details of the source in which you found the poem.

Since MLA style does not include dates in the parenthetical references, just give the page title in quotation marks: The firm opened in 2011 ("History"). Just as with sites with authors, you would include the page, paragraph number or section number when possible.
