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### Sources For Microgreens Seeds Needs

Some General Guidelines: Microgreens in general prefer a soil pH of near 6.0 at germination in their water, soil or hydroponic solution. Most municipal water systems are too high (too acidic) in pH for optimum swelling and shoot strength. See “ pH balancing your water ” guideline for more.

### Microgreen Seeds Sheet | The Best Seed Sheet for Growing ...

For growing microgreens, seek only untreated seeds. Mail order sources for gardening and farming seeds number in the hundreds, but only one or two dozen offer untreated or organically-grown (OG) seeds. Organic is preferred to conventionally grown, except when either poverty or parsimony dictates thrift.

### Do You Need To Soak Your Microgreen Seeds? - Thistle Downs ...

The microgreen seed should then be weighed and sown onto the wetted surface as evenly as possible. Using a seed shaker can assist with this process, but note that each species requires a different sowing density. As soon as the seeds germinate, microgreens require light and nutrients to produce the highest quality product.

### Hydroponic Microgreens: The Next Food Revolution | Grow ...

Chia. The preferred media of chia microgreen is hydroponic, take two 10x20 tray one for growing and other for covering. Now add 1 ounce of chia seeds to one of the trays and spay water after that cover the tray with another tray to make a complete blackout for about 3-5 days. These seeds don’t require any pre-soaking.

### Why Microgreen Seed Density is Important - Home Microgreens

Seeds can be soaked in this solution for 10 minutes. This is a solution Curtis Stone, popular microgreen grower and author of “The Urban Farmer,” uses in his commercial microgreen operation. Larger seeds like peas can benefit from an additional 8-hour soak in clean water to help initiate germination, according to Grant.

### Managing diseases in microgreens - Produce Grower

Pre-soaking of the seed is recommended with some microgreens. When pre-soaking is recommended, it’s very important to follow the recommended duration of soak. Microgreens that should be pre-soaked are sunflower, pea, beets, buckwheat, chard, corn shoots to name a few.

Whereas sprouts are seeds that germinate by being soaked and rinsed in water, microgreens are grown in soil. During seed germination, the cotyledon (s) or seed leave (s) emerge from the soil first. [A cotyledon is part of the embryo within the seed of the plant.]
